

We want to encourage the adoption of clean technology in our industry. We are leading the way by choosing to invest in alternative transportation and establishing research partnerships that help us unearth the potential for a greener future in boating.

HEALTHY LOCAL ECOLOGY:

We have a deep respect and appreciation for the natural beauty of the Pacific Northwest, and we recognize that ecological health is vital to both our industry and our region. We understand that we must play an active role in conserving and restoring the habitats and waterways in which we operate.

WHAT WE ARE DOING:

- Engaged in shoreline rehabilitation and are fully honouring an established Habitat Conservation Plan for our region.
- Partnered with local conservation groups, including Friends of Victoria Harbour Migratory Bird Sanctuary, Ocean Legacy Foundation.
- Signed the pledge to certify with the Clean Marine BC program (https://georgiastrait.org/work/cleanmarinebc/), an ecocertification for marinas developed by the Georgia Strait Alliance.

CARBON NEUTRAL 2020

Victoria International Marina is committed to taking responsibility for our impact on climate change, with the ultimate goal of being Carbon Neutral by 2020. We first minimize our carbon footprint by choosing renewable and energy-efficient technologies and reducing and recycling waste. We will then purchase carbon offsets to neutralize our remaining emissions.

WHAT WE ARE DOING:

- Committed to reducing and recycling waste, such that 90% of all waste produced and collected onsite is kept out of the landfill.
- · Our onsite waste management system includes separated streams for organics, paper, cardboard, glass, tin, soft and hard plastics, Styrofoam, batteries & electronics, and oil.
- Building uses energy-efficient air source heat pumps and ENERGYSTAR equipment.

We believe we have the ability to create a positive impact on the local economy by partnering with the best local businesses in the region, from our tenants and suppliers to the eco-tourism companies we recommend to our quests.

Future Oceans Designers are champions for ocean conservation, and sustainable fashion. The designers featured in the inaugural event were chosen from a pool of applicants for their vision, experience, and potential to have a social impact.

In addition to creating two runway ready looks, each designer will produce a work of wearable art using reclaimed ocean plastic provided by the Ocean Legacy Foundation. The goal is to inspire the public, and our influential guests, to lead by example and implement much needed changes in fashion production.

The Future Oceans designers will be innovating new uses and applications for recycled materials, and sharing their journeys of discovery along the way in the form of social media and documentary. Video footage will be captured by the Future Oceans Documentary Team, led by Director Kamp Kennedy.


The Future Oceans Organizing Team will be seeking three paid summer internships to offer to three awardees, selected from the Designer Finalists, immediately following the fashion show.




Our Talent Showcase

On July 1, VIMs Future Oceans Fashion Show will open with a powerful dance performance by the Nanaimo Contemporary Ballet Company, titled "Plastic Whale." Directed by Chantelle Norris with original music composed by Alan Donnelly, Plastic Whale is a creative collaboration involving 20 professional dancers and five costume designers working with recycled and eco-friendly materials. Artistic lighting design will be provided by Orange Frog Productions, with AV support provided by PK Sound.

This inspired performance piece is one of the highlights of the Future Oceans Canada Day Celebration. It is a testament to the passion brought forth by creative communities to help draw much needed awareness to both the problem of plastics in our oceans, and to innovative and creative solutions. Inspired by the Future Oceans call to action, Erina has created a series of light dresses and accessories constructed from recycled PET bottles which have been heat molded, LED technology and sensors. Her complex designs make a powerful statement about plastic as a precious material, as opposed to one that is disposable.
